"Stay with God! Take heart. Don't quit. I say it again: Stay with God." (Psalm 27:14 MSG) As P.A.S.S. Parish came together July 1, 2017 we set this verse before us. The words from the NRSV reading of this verse have the same meaning, but sometimes different words help us with revealing deeper meaning, even if it all boils down to be the same in the end. Though it will be a bit before we are informed of a new configuration by the Bishop and the Cabinet, there has been a request for a change and our District Superintendent, Ron Carlson, has petitioned them to make change a reality in a timely manner. This brings Psalm 27 into our midst as a prayer for faith, patience, wherewithal and trust. Please join me in prayer, that these traits might be ours as we live in faith that God's love and leading are indeed what we seek as we enter this next chapter of faith-filled living.

# MISSION TEAMS OF EACH CHURCH Updated information for Ingathering 2018

You may or may not be aware that UMCOR has changed a few things regarding both the hygiene and school kits. Here are differences and changes we need to be aware of (as of **Aug 20, 2018)**.

#### Hygiene kits

- No metal nail files or emery boards. ONLY fingernail or toenail clipper
- 10 band-aids, instead of the 6 previously asked for Folding directions are in <u>Ingathering book</u>, and slide packet into 1-gallon ziplock bag and close.

#### School kits

- Kits are to be packed in 2-gallon ziplock bags (instead of cloth school bags.)
- Kits are to contain 3 one-subject notebooks, AND a package of looseleaf paper (wide ruled or college rule accepted).
- Stack paper, put smaller items on top and slide into bag, burp and close.

THIS YEAR ONLY – If you have school kits assembled with just the spiral notebooks, we will still send them. If you can add a package of loose leaf, great! Next year will be different. Many did not realize they are asking for BOTH kinds of paper.

**<u>THIS YEAR</u>** – If you have cloth bags you have packed the school supplies in, you may bring them as they are. DO NOT use both plastic and the cloth bag. Keep kits in cloth bags and kits in plastic separated so they can be boxed for shipping, but add the numbers together on the remittance sheet – they all have the same value.

If you have unused cloth bags, consider donating them locally or sending them to Midwest Mission, 1001 Mission Drive, Pawnee IL 62558.

- \*1 new hand towel (15"x25" up to 17"x27")
- \*1 new washcloth
- \*1 bath-sized bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz. or larger); No Ivory or Jergens
- \*1 large, sturdy comb (at least 6 inches of teeth)
- \*1 adult toothbrush in original sealed wrapper
- \*10 band aids (3/4"-1") 1 toe nail or fingernail clipper (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
